Parent-Child Book Clubs

According to research from the Center for Summer Learning at Johns Hopkins University, students who participate in summer reading programs after kindergarten, first and second grade are less likely to be held back in future years AND middle school students who read four or five books during the summer experienced gains in fall reading achievement comparable to attending summer school. Forming a book club will help keep boredom at bay, build on academic skills and nurture a love of reading.

Joining a book club can teach these valuable skills:

- Learn to read for enjoyment
- Build parent-child bonds
- Read as a social activity

WRITING Stories with a Twist

Encourage your child to stretch their writing by giving stories a new twist.

Materials: favorite story, paper, pencil

Together, read one of your child's favorite stories, such as "Goldilocks and the Three Bears." When you finish, work together to rewrite the story with a different setting. Perhaps it could take place in another country or in the middle of a big city. Ask your child to think about how the setting will change the story. For instance, if the three bears live in an apartment, how will Goldilocks get inside?

Invite your child to share their new story with the rest of the family at dinnertime.

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
